Most of the people I know are either dance leaders, dancers, or musicians so I feel I am well connected with the dance scene in Western Colorado.



# Highlights of the April 13, 2024 Delegate Meeting

### A. Proposed Changes to the ASRDA Constitution

Proposed changes to the ASRDA Constitution and By-Laws were discussed at the Delegate Meeting on April 13, 2024. ASRDA Delegates were given an opportunity to ask questions. The changes to the constitution involve the following:

- 1. Elected officers having voting rights.
  - •Each elected officer position is allowed one (1) vote at the Delegate Meeting even if a couple holds the position. If an elected officer is not present at a meeting, no person can vote in place of the absent officer.
- 2. When newly elected officers can be sworn in
  - •The July Installation dance shall occur as close to 1 July as possible. The ASRDA elected and appointed officers may be installed at the last delegate meeting of the year immediately following their election in April or on the same day as the Installation Dance at the discretion of the current ASRDA President.
- 3. Callers and cuers being allowed to hold ASRDA elected and appointed offices.
  - •The current board and delegated determined that callers and cuers can be elected officers of ASRDA.
- 4. Newsletter distribution.
  - •The Association Newsletter shall be published and made available to all dancers free on the ASRDA website.
- 5. Changes to the dissolution guidelines.
  - •After all conditions of Sections 2 and 3 of this Article have been met, and as a part of the final dissolution, all funds remaining in the Association treasury shall be transferred to each of the Member Clubs comprising ASRDA and the TSFSRD's Teen Scholarship Fund in an even division. New Member Clubs with less than three (3) years of membership in ASRDA will not be included in the distribution of funds.

For further information, please refer to the Minutes of the Delegate Meeting for April13th, 2024 posted on the website for the reasons for the changes to the ASRDA Constitution. If you disagree, please discuss your concerns with your ASRDA club delegate.

# B. Guidelines for Medical Emergency at a Dance

- 1. If a dancer goes down in a square, make a circle around the dancer. Everyone in the square raises their hands to get the caller's attention.
- 2. Assess the situation
- 3. Call 911 for assistance, if necessary.
- 4. Have someone go outside to direct EMS.
- 5. Have someone stay with the person needing help making sure they

are not crowded by well-meaning dancers.

- 6. Follow basic first aid assistance such as:
  - a. Apply ice for swelling,
  - b. Add pressure to any bleeding
  - c. Make sure the person doesn't move if there is a chance of a broken bone, etc.
- 7. When the situation is under control, complete the incident report found at asrda.org/resources.
- 8. Give the insurance claim information to the person needing assistance.

# C. Possible Change to Dancer of the Year Award

Currently, only ASRDA dancers who make a significant contribution to ASRDA over a short period of time or have sustained service to ASRDA over a long period of time are eligible to be nominated for *Dancer of the Year*.



Since fewer and fewer dancers are volunteering to help out as elected or appointed officers at the ASRDA level or serve on ASRDA committees, while callers and cuers are stepping up to help out, it was proposed and discussed that callers and cuers be included as possible nominees for this award.

Joe Lowe, founder of this award, felt it should be up to the prior Dancer of the Year Recipients as to whether or not to include callers and cuers. The club delegates felt strongly that the delegate vote should be considered. Dancer of the Year recipients will be queried as to whether or not callers and cuers could be nominated for this award. This will be shared with the delegates at the July meeting. Caller and cuer contributions will not include any activity for which they receive financial reimbursement.

# D. Lesson Loss Reimbursement Policy

The Lesson Loss Reimbursement Policy was created to help clubs who lose money when offering lessons. *The Reimbursement Policy only applies to Mainstream square dance lessons or beginning round dance lessons.* 

The policy was not finalized at the delegate meeting because it is unclear what constitutes a group of beginning round dance lessons which equates to the same number of weeks as a square dance mainstream class. ASRDA cuers, Bob Kurczewski, Ron and Pat Plouch, and Tricia Morley and Dennis Artz will discuss this prior to the next delegate meeting and propose an equitable number of classes or hours that will constitute "beginning round dance classes."

# E. 2024-2025 ASRDA Board Members Elected

The following individuals were unanimously elected to serve on the 2024-2025 ASRDA Board:

All elected officers were sworn in immediately after the election.



## An alternate mode of transportation

### to the 73rd National Square Dance Convention

#### in Milwaukee, Wisconsin June 26 - 29, 2024

For those looking for a unique and very possibly low cost way to get to downtown Milwaukee this coming summer, consider Amtrak. Eight of us from the 74th NSDC committee traveled by train in February from Texarkana, Arkansas to the Intermodal station in downtown Milwaukee for the Preconvention. In spite of the snow, we arrived on time and at a cost of under \$130/each, round trip. The convention center was within walking distance of the train station, or at most, a very short shuttle hop. Amtrak, at the time, had a special of up to 60% off, provided up to 8 persons traveled as a group, all on the same schedule. That same special is occurring right now. Note, these are for very comfortable seats, not rooms with beds. Amtrak also provides a meal car for all passengers. The Amtrak website is

Share Fares provides a group discount of up to 60% off tickets for 8 passengers traveling together on the same reservation. Here's how the discount works:

Passenger One - full price ( or lowest available fare)

Passenger Two - full price ( or lowest available fare)

Passenger Three - 17% off all tickets

Passenger four - 30% off all tickets

Passenger five - 39% off all tickets

Passenger six - 47% off all tickets

Passenger seven - 54% off all tickets

Passenger eight - 60% off all tickets.



Please realize Amtrak utilizes the same track as the freight lines, and is subordinate to these trains, so you may experience a delay, or like us, you may not. If you should opt to fly to Chicago on one of the low cost carries and transfer to Amtrak, take this into consideration. Chicago Union Station to Milwaukee intermodal is only a short 90 mile trip and again takes you right downtown. No need for a car (or parking).

As a future alert, for those planning to attend the 74th NSDC in Shreveport, Louisiana in 2025, or the 75th NSDC in Waco, Texas in 2026, Amtrak services both areas, with a short bus route connecting directly to Shreveport or Waco. This would allow those wishing to fly, to either destination, to utilize the low cost carriers through Dallas Fort Worth International or Dallas Love Field (Southwest Airlines). For those wishing to rent a car in Dallas, parking should be easy in either place.






