**President's Message
September 2020**

Another month has gone by and most of us still are not dancing. Many clubs are not dancing because the halls where they dance are still closed while other clubs' members just aren't ready to return to dancing.

The good news is that there is now some in-person dancing happening in our area. On Wednesday, August 12th, Canyon Lake Square Dancers had their first dance since Wayne's illness. Wayne used as many Cajun tunes as he could find in memory of Grady George (Grady's obituary is included in this month's Chaplain's Corner). Canyon Lake will continue to dance every Wednesday evening from 7 – 9pm at the building behind Goofy's Bar and Grill at Canyon Lake.

Dan Clairmont is calling for the Killeen Kickers in Killeen. If you are interested in attending one of those dances, contact Dan for details. Hill Country Squares is still not dancing because their hall is not yet available.

There is also LOTS of virtual square and round dancing from callers and cuers all over the world. The links to these virtual dances can be found on the ASRDA website, courtesy of Charlette Larson from SunDancers in Georgetown.

I "attended" the evening virtual benefit dance for Mike Sikorsky on Saturday August 8th. One hundred forty-eight dancers logged into Zoom that evening. There were literally people from all over the world – China, Japan, Australia, Canada, Europe and U.S. Most people were dancing but others, like me, just watched. There we singles, couples, and several square dance clubs who got together to dance to the virtual calling. Johnny Preston and Mike Seastrom were the host callers but there were a bunch of other well-known callers available to call a tip. Between tips the dancers were unmuted and allowed to talk with each other. It was quite an experience. Since the fundraising started, over \$25,000.00 has been raised for Mike's medical bills. Last we heard Mike is still in rehab. Updates are posted on Mike Sikorsky's webpage.

For all you round dancers out there, I just talked to Jerry and Lucy Pate. They normally call round dancing at SunDancers as well as Shirts N Skirts, but because of COVID, no dancing is allowed at SunDancers and even when they open to dancing, no visitors will be allowed in. Shirts N Skirts has not started dancing yet either. Jerry and Lucy have been watching COVID numbers and once they are low enough for small group gatherings, they hope to restart Merry-Go-Rounds. They have already started looking for venues. They plan to follow the "Reopening Guidelines" that were posted on the ASRDA website to keep people safe. Stay tuned for further information on this.

A virtual ASRDA Delegate meeting was held August 16, 2020. A number of items were discussed and several decisions were made regarding the association proceedings. I would like to thank all the club presidents and delegates who either voted and/or attended this long overdue delegate meeting and for our ASRDA treasurer, Tom Barrett, for setting up the meeting. The results of this meeting are summarized on page 3 of this newsletter. A complete set of minutes of the meeting are available upon request to myself or to Hubert O'Neal for anyone who desires a copy.

**SUMMARY OF DELEGATES MEETING
AUGUST 16, 2020**

The following decisions were made:

- 1) The number of delegates per club has been changed from 2 delegates and 1 alternate to 1 delegate and 1 alternate for both caller/cuer and dancer run clubs. Each club therefore has one vote. The past presidents' committee also has one vote. This will make it much easier to have a quorum present at meetings so decisions requiring a majority vote can be decided. The ASRDA meetings are open to anyone in ASRDA who wishes to attend.
- 2) It was decided that the Guidelines for Handling Inappropriate Dance Behavior be modified to decrease the amount of recommended paperwork. While most clubs agreed with the guidelines, the majority wanted to handle inappropriate behavior in their own way with a policy at the ASRDA level to back them up. The revised guidelines will be presented at the next ASRDA delegate meeting.
- 3) ASRDA hosted the Conclave dance back in March. A ton of work goes into hosting a Federation dance. Country Cuzzins did the majority of the work and were the only club in ASRDA that had any kind of showing both nights at the dance. The ASRDA board members decided to award Country Cuzzins \$250.00 for their work. Hosting a Federation dance is supposed to be a combined effort of all ASRDA clubs. In the event that only one or two clubs do all the work in the future, those clubs will receive a monetary award.
- 4) Requirements for ASRDA membership were reviewed and greater than 2/3 of the delegates voted to remove clubs who were not meeting the requirements. There were several issues surrounding requirements but the main one was the clubs not paying Federation membership dues. One hundred percent of clubs in each association must pay \$5/dancer in Federation dues. If this is not done, the offending association loses its voting rights at the Federation level and the ability to bid on Federation dances. Clubs can reapply for membership in ASRDA at any time and their acceptance is dependent on a majority delegate vote.
- 5) There has been an ongoing issue with conflicting dances. The issue has been addressed at multiple ASRDA meetings but has not improved significantly. Here are the new guidelines.
 - a. All clubs must check the Social Secretary's calendar before scheduling a special dance.
 - b. ASRDA clubs should not schedule a special dance on the same night another ASRDA club or the Association has a special dance.
 - c. The Social Secretary and the Webmaster will refuse to post any special dance on a date that has already been reserved by another club.
 - d. Prior to scheduling a special dance, each club should check dates of Federation dances and other really big special dances in other Associations (such as Cornhuskers, February Frenzy, etc.) It is RECOMMENDED a club not schedule a dance on the same weekend because the turnout will not be as good as it would be if not competing with a big dance.
 - e. Non-ASRDA clubs and other Associations' dances cannot be advertised on the ASRDA website or in the newsletter if they conflict with an ASRDA club's special dance or an ASRDA sponsored dance. This includes posting flyers on the website and in the newsletter. If there is no conflict, the non-ASRDA clubs and Associations

- a. may post flyers on our website and in the RCS newsletter for \$25/flyer.
- b. Non-ASRDA clubs and other Associations' dance are welcome to bring hard copy flyers to ASRDA club dances.
- c. These rules were created to give ASRDA member clubs priority in advertising, prevent overlapping dances and hopefully increase attendance at club dances.
- d. A formal policy on this will be written and distributed to all club presidents.

Many of the decisions that were made at this meeting are different from what is currently in the ASRDA Constitution and By-Laws. The Board will be reviewing the ASRDAA Constitution and By-Laws and propose updates/changes to the delegates for a vote. Brooke Peters will take the lead on this.

When not dancing at campouts and events, you could catch Grady getting four friends together to play 42 or simply offering a friendly ear for a thoughtful conversation.

Grady was a fisherman, hunter, and loved to cook for family. Grady's signature dishes always included special Cajun seasoning and lots of love. Sitting down to eat with Grady and Sue always meant a great meal and conversation that left you feeling loved and cared for.

Grady made an immense impact on many people's lives. If you had a problem and needed honest advice, Grady was the man to go to. If something was broken, Grady could fix it.

If you showed up hungry, Grady would be one of the first to offer you food. Whether it was known or not, Grady always looked out for others and showed care for many. We all Thank You for everything you added to our lives and the love you shared with Sue. Grady will be sorely missed and will be dancing in Heaven forevermore.

WHEEL-N-DEALS

Wheel-N-Deals regrets to report that we do not know when we will be dancing again. This is the latest guidance we have received from the City of San Marcos:

“At this time, we are unsure when the Activity Center, river park system, and facilities will reopen. A team consisting of our Director of Public Safety, Emergency Management Coordinator, health department, and other City staff are using specific metrics to evaluate the safety of reopening. In the meantime, we are working on safety protocols/procedures, modifying our programs/events, and developing new program/events to serve our community.”

Depending on State of Texas guidelines on the number of people allowed at an outdoor gathering, we MAY consider evening outdoor dances once the weather really cools off – as in towards the end of October. Masks will be mandatory at any dance Wheel-N-Deals sponsored dance until there is a COVID vaccine and/or COVID is no longer a threat.

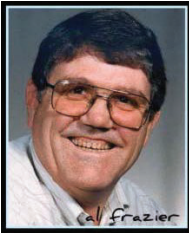
